2025 C-PASS UPDATE



School for Social Work

The Committee for Program Affordability and Student Support (C-PASS) was created to continue the work of the student-led Pay for Placement (P4P) movement.

The School's 2024 Strategic Plan includes goals of addressing affordability and access challenges across all degree programs.

Integrating this work into the School's formal structure is one of the key ways we are advancing this work.

The committee includes leadership from the deans' office, practicum, admissions and financial aid, student support, and P4P student representatives.

C-PASS met regularly from October to April and established both Year 1 and Year 2 goals. What follows is a report on our progress to date.





New 1,536-hour requirement effective Fall 2026; still exceeds accreditation standards and emerging industry norms

Increased sites offering EBFI/ stipend from 25% to 32%; 33% of students placed with stipends despite some going unfilled

TASK STATUS

Confirm SSW's involvement in the college's upcoming Strategic Planning Process We are generally involved in their strategic plan, just as they are in ours



Expand Support for Basic Needs

TASK

Create a student health insurance navigator position to help students learn more about applying for Mass Health

Create a public transportation support resource for students including (at a minimum) a list of grad student discounts for public transportation in placement cities. Move toward a system of providing low cost or free transportation passes to students who need them

Develop an education module or resource on student loans and managing loan repayment [clarify how formal vs informal] and discuss the SSW student experience

Collect information about food insecurity mitigation efforts at other higher ed institutions. [consult, research]

STATUS

Shifted to offer info meetings and info on online. Importantly, after extensive discussions, we revised the waiver procedure for the state-required Student Health Insurance Program (SHIP)

Our research shows that we are not able to afford or manage a program to pre-purchase public transportation passes in multiple cities, due to the high minimum purchase requirements and the passes' expiration dates


We can only offer anecdotal experiences because there are continuously changing federal regulations (e.g., alum panelmanaging financially)

TASK


Help students to form a student government; Run Student Org elections

Engage National Association of Deans and Directors (NADD) to identify key advocacy efforts across the country Co-chaired NADD Pay for Placement (P4P) Workgroup; produced report on how social work programs are responding to P4P; Organized conference session drawing 50 deans and directors. Final report will be shared with NADD in September 2025


Engage New England Consortium of Graduate Field Education Directors to identify key advocacy efforts


Ongoing monthly discussions for information and strategy sharing




Developing Goals for Year 2

Revise hourly practicum requirement	Completed, launches fall 2026
